

The "American Health Security & Innovation" Act (\$101.43B)

Strengthening our communities, securing our medical future, and protecting our children.

Allocating **\$101.43 billion** (90% of the funds from major for-profit health systems) into a comprehensive government aid package would significantly reshape U.S. public health.

1. Fast-Tracking American Cures & Safety (\$60.86 Billion)

We are investing in the research and oversight needed to keep American families safe and lead the world in medical breakthroughs.

- **The "Cure for Cancer & Heart Disease" Fund:** \$30 Billion for the NIH to accelerate clinical trials and find permanent cures for the chronic diseases that affect every American family.
- **National Health Security:** \$18 Billion for the CDC to ensure we are never caught off-guard by a health crisis again, focusing on early detection and rapid response.
- **Drug Safety & Low-Cost Approval:** \$12.86 Billion for the FDA to speed up the approval of safe, generic medications and life-saving vaccines, helping lower costs for everyone.

2. Restoring Local Care & Rural Health (\$30.43 Billion)

Healthcare should be available in your hometown, not just in big cities. This fund supports the local doctors and nurses who serve as our primary safety net.

- **State Empowerment Grants:** Direct funding to all 50 states to support local community clinics and charitable hospitals that provide essential care to hardworking families.
- **Hometown Medical Support:** Dedicated funds to recruit and keep doctors and nurses in rural areas and underserved neighborhoods, ending "medical deserts."
- **Family Health Services:** Supporting local health centers that provide vital screenings, preventive care, and wellness resources for mothers and children.

3. The "Healthy Students" Initiative (\$10.14 Billion)

Empowering parents and schools with the tools to keep our youth healthy, informed, and safe as they grow.

- **Evidence-Based Life Skills:** Providing school districts with modern, factual health education resources that focus on prevention, personal responsibility, and healthy decision-making.

- **School Wellness Centers:** Investing in on-campus student health offices to provide immediate mental health support and first aid, ensuring kids stay in class and stay healthy.
- **Teacher Resources:** Equipping educators with the most up-to-date, scientifically accurate training to answer students' health questions and promote long-term well-being.

The figure of **\$10,143,000,000** represents the final **10% portion** of the total federal health funding package, designated specifically for sexual health education, research, and support infrastructure. This fund serves as the administrative and specialized backbone for both federal and state-level health programs.

Strategic Allocation of the 10% Fund

- **Infrastructure & Technical Support:** In accordance with federal guidelines, **10% of specific program funding**—such as the [guttmacher.org/sites/default/files/document/2019/06/19/10percentfund.pdf](https://www.guttmacher.org/sites/default/files/document/2019/06/19/10percentfund.pdf) legally reserved for training, technical assistance, and high-quality evaluation to ensure program integrity and effectiveness.
- **Targeted Adolescent Health:** This fund supports initiatives like the [siecus.org/statement-on-sexual-health-education](https://www.siecus.org/statement-on-sexual-health-education), which provides young people with medically accurate information on both abstinence and contraception.

- **Sexual Risk Avoidance Education (SRAE):** A portion of these funds is directed toward sam.gov/fal/373f3f24c18..., which teach youth to voluntarily refrain from non-marital sexual activity and other risky behaviors.

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Key 2026 Policy Impacts

- **Funding Stability:** As of February 2026, Congress has maintained level funding for these critical programs, providing a temporary safeguard against proposed cuts that sought to eliminate evidence-based initiatives in favor of abstinence-only models.
- **Modernization Initiatives:** Under the Real Education and Access for Healthy Youth Act (REAHYA), there is a legislative push to redirect these funds toward holistic, LGBTQ+-inclusive sexual health education and the congress.gov/bill/119th...
- **Public Health Oversight:** The fund allows for the congress.gov/bill/119th... regarding effective practices in preventing STIs, including HIV, and addressing interpersonal violence among youth.

The figure of **\$30,429,000,000** represents the **30% share** of the total federal health funding package specifically designated for state-level health initiatives and the community safety net. This allocation supports over nafcclinics.org and health centers that serve as the primary source of care for uninsured and underinsured populations.

State-Level Healthcare Distribution

- **Safety-Net Funding:** This portion of the budget is critical for hrsa.gov/grants/find-fu... and grants.gov/search-resul..., which provide primary care, dental, and behavioral health services regardless of a patient's ability to pay.

- **State Block Grants:** A significant amount is distributed via state-administered grants to support localized health needs, including chronic disease management and preventive screenings.
- **Workforce Support:** Funds are directed toward vmghealth.com/insights/..., ensuring that clinics in medically underserved areas have the nursing and dental staff necessary to remain operational.

Strategic Priorities for 2026

- **Chronic Disease Prevention:** States use these funds to expand "wellness centers" and youtube.com/watch?v=Bhk..., focusing on nutrition and preventive care to reduce long-term hospitalization costs.
- **Technical Assistance (TA):** National programs receive funding to provide TA to these state clinics, helping them improve operational efficiency and meet federal compliance standards.
- **Immigrant and Rural Access:** This package addresses specific barriers to care by funding outreach programs in rural communities and providing coordinated care for vulnerable populations, such as those living with HIV.

Impact of Funding Shifts

While this \$30.4 billion maintains the state-level safety net, the 2026 fiscal environment includes aabb.org/news-resources... to the broader Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). Consequently, many states are increasingly reliant on this specific "30% package" to offset the loss of other federal subsidies and to stabilize clinics facing an fxbgadvance.com/p/virgi....
