

The “We were drugged” Act: Implementation Structure

The Act is built on a “**Restorative Justice**” logic: because the profits were generated from the health of the public, they are legally returned to secure the public’s three most fundamental needs: **Safety, Sobriety, and Shelter.**

Act Provision

Mandate & Annual Target

Title I: The Right to Shelter

Eliminates chronic homelessness via a “Housing First” national standard.

1.5 Million homes secured

Title II: Recovery on Demand

Guarantees free, immediate access to addiction treatment for every citizen.

4 Million recovery slots

Title III: The Safety Shield

Funds universal domestic abuse protection and long-term survivor autonomy.

Universal shelter access

Title IV: The Prevention Clause

Mandates mental health counselors in every public school (K-12). **100%** school coverage

Economic “Frictionless” Entry

Unlike traditional taxes, the “**We were drugged**” Act is structured as a **Restitution Levy**. This ensures the funds are:

- **Locked-Box Protected:** The money cannot be diverted to the general Treasury; it must stay within the “We wer drugged” Bucket.
- **Direct-to-Service:** Bypasses heavy federal bureaucracy by funding local community organizations and specialized non-profits directly.

The Impact Statement

Under this Act, the **\$66.12 billion** doesn’t just “help”—it solves. By providing permanent housing, we eliminate the primary driver of high-cost emergency room visits. By providing addiction treatment on demand, we collapse the street-level drug market.
